s.32 Resignation

On May 7, 2014 a Resignation Committee of the Benchers of the Law Society of Alberta granted the application of **Paul Wozniak** to resign effective August 31, 2014. Mr. Wozniak is an active member of the Law Society of Alberta who practices in Calgary, Alberta.

At the time of his application, Mr. Wozniak was facing discipline proceedings in which it was alleged that he enabled others to achieve an improper purpose, engaged in conduct to deceive others and acted in a conflict of interest. The Resignation Committee determined it was in the best interest of the public to permit Mr. Wozniak to resign under Section 32 of the Legal *Profession Act* rather than having a hearing regarding the allegations against him, given that:

- 1. Mr. Wozniak signed a Statement of Facts in which he admitted facts that would have supported these allegations.
- 2. Mr. Wozniak undertook never to apply for readmission to the Law Society of Alberta.
- 3. In the event that Mr. Wozniak applies to be relived of this undertaking, costs of \$43,362.54 will have to be paid.
- 4. Mr. Wozniak undertook not to act as an agent as contemplated by Section 106(2)(I) of the Legal Profession Act.

Mr. Wozniak will therefore no longer be a member of the Law Society of Alberta effective August 31, 2014.
