### **Suspension**

On April 26, 2007, a Hearing Committee accepted the admission of guilt of the member and found that the conduct of **Susan Hendricks**, who resides in Victoria, British Columbia, and formerly practiced in Calgary, Alberta, was deserving of sanction in that she:

- Failed to serve, report to and respond to a client;
- Failed to respond to another client;
- Failed to file Forms S & T and failed to cooperate with a Rule 130 audit; and
- Failed to respond to the Law Society regarding four other citations.

The Hearing Committee directed, pursuant to section 72(1)(b) of the *Legal Profession Act*, R.S.A. 2000, c. L-8, that the membership of **Ms. Hendricks** be suspended for 12 months. The Hearing Committee further ordered that should **Ms. Hendricks** apply for reinstatement, her application shall be referred to the Practice Review Committee to confirm her ability to meet her obligations to her clients and to the Law Society. **Ms. Hendricks** is required to pay the actual costs of the hearing, estimated to be \$6,850.05.
