### **Termination of Registration**

**SPECIFICS:**

On November 21, 2011, a Resignation Committee of the Benchers of the Law Society of Alberta granted the application of **Todd Sullivan – Student-at-Law** to resign, pursuant to Section 61 of the *Legal Profession Act*, R.S.A. 2000, c. L-8. Termination of the registration of a student-at-law is equivalent to disbarment of a member and in this case is effective immediately. Mr. Sullivan resides in Calgary, Alberta.

At the time of his resignation, Mr. Sullivan faced a discipline hearing on three citations. The citations alleged that Mr. Sullivan failed to conscientiously serve the interests of his clients, lied to or misled his clients and lied to or misled his principal. Mr. Sullivan admitted facts and the foregoing allegations.

The Resignation Committee directed that Mr. Sullivan pay the actual costs of the resignation application, estimated at \$1,963.50.

The Resignation Committee further directed, in accordance with Section 78(6) of the *Legal Profession Act*, that the Executive Director send a copy of the hearing record to the Minister of Justice and Attorney General.

As a student-at-law, Mr. Sullivan did not have a practice and no custodian has been appointed.
