## Suspension

On May 15, 2018, a Hearing Committee of the Law Society of Alberta found Christopher T. Tahn, a member of the Law Society who lives and practices in Calgary, to be guilty of the following:

- (1) Misconduct in relation to clients, including failing to keep clients informed, failing to respond to clients, failing to follow instructions, failing to be courteous to clients, and failing to advance clients' legal matters;
- (2) Misconduct in relation to other lawyers, including failing to comply with trust conditions from other lawyers, failing to comply with his own undertakings, and attempting to mislead another lawyer;
- (3) Misconduct in relation to practice management, including failing to maintain records, failing to supervise his assistant, and failing to comply with the accounting rules; and
- (4) Misconduct in relation to the Law Society, including failing to be candid with investigators and failing to respond when required to do so.

The Hearing Committee ordered that Mr. Tahn be suspended for 15 months, starting on July 1, 2018, pursuant to section 72(1)(b) of the *Legal Profession Act*.

It was not necessary to appoint a custodian during the period of suspension.

The full written decision of the Hearing Committee will be posted to the Law Society's website when it is issued.
