Section 32 Resignation in the Face of Discipline

On April 9, 2019, a Resignation Committee of the Law Society of Alberta accepted an application by Toby D. Schultz, a suspended member of the Law Society who lives and practised in Calgary, Alberta, to resign pursuant to section 32 of the Legal Profession Act. Mr. Schultz's resignation is effective immediately.

Mr. Schultz became inactive in December 2016 and was suspended in June 2017. At the time of his resignation, Mr. Schultz was facing 17 citations arising from five complaints. As part of his resignation application, Mr. Schultz signed a Statement of Facts admitting guilt to all citations which included failing to provide competent, timely, conscientious, and diligent service to clients by failing to take steps to move their litigation matters forward, failing to preserve their claims following dismissal, failing to withdraw as counsel of record when appropriate, failing to appear in Court, failing to communicate with clients and other lawyers, failing to take steps to address a default judgment and a writ of enforcement, failing to comply with several sections of the accounting rules, and failing to fulfil an undertaking.

The full written decision of the Resignation Committee will be posted to the Law Society of Alberta website when it is issued.
