## Suspension

On May 7, 2019, a Hearing Committee of the Law Society of Alberta considered the conduct of David Kobylnyk, a member of the Law Society who lives and practices in Calgary, Alberta. Mr. Kobylnyk made admissions supporting seven citations, including failing to serve his clients; failing to be candid with a client; signing a Consent Order without the instructions of his client; failing to respond in a timely manner to communications from another lawyer; failing to respond to and cooperate with the Law Society; and failing to comply with the trust accounting rules of the Law Society. The Hearing Committee accepted Mr. Kobylnyk's admissions of guilt and ordered that he be suspended for two months commencing August 1, 2019. He was also ordered to pay \$30,000 in costs.

The full written decision of the Hearing Committee will be posted to the Law Society of Alberta website when it is issued.
