## Section 32 Resignation in the Face of Discipline

On October 9, 2019, a Resignation Committee of the Law Society of Alberta accepted an application by Laurie Wood, a member of the Law Society who practised in Edmonton, Alberta, to resign in the face of discipline pursuant to section 32 of the *Legal Profession Act.* Ms. Wood's resignation was effective October 9, 2019.

At the time of her resignation Ms. Wood was facing 11 citations including breach of the Law Society's accounting rules, failure to supervise a person providing services to her firm, failure to cooperate with a Law Society investigation, rendering inappropriate billings to Legal Aid, and failure to be candid with the Privacy Commissioner and Alberta Employment Standards. Ms. Wood admitted to conduct deserving of sanction regarding 8 citations.

The full written decision of the Resignation Committee was issued December 10, 2019 and has been posted to the Law Society of Alberta website.
