Section 61 Resignation - Deemed Disbarment

On May 4, 2021, a Resignation Committee of the Law Society of Alberta accepted an application by Laurie J. Cunningham, a member of the Law Society, to resign pursuant to section 61 of the Legal Profession Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. L-8 (the "Act"). Ms. Cunningham is therefore disbarred, effective immediately.

Ms. Cunningham resides and practiced in Edmonton, Alberta. At the time of her resignation, Ms. Cunningham was facing disciplinary proceedings with the Law Society in relation to her conviction of an indictable offence. On February 3, 2020, Ms. Cunningham pled guilty to manslaughter pursuant to section 236(b) of the Criminal Code. On February 5, 2020, Ms. Cunningham was sentenced to 5 years imprisonment and the Law Society automatically suspended her membership pursuant to section 83(7) of the Act.

As Ms. Cunningham was not practicing at the time of her resignation, there is no custodian for her practice.
