Termination of Registration

On April 3, 2023, a Hearing Committee of the Law Society of Alberta terminated the registration of **John Henri (Johnny) Faul**, a student-at-law, effective immediately. Pursuant to section 49(5)(b) of the *Legal Profession Act*, termination of registration of a student-at-law is equivalent to disbarment. In practical terms, this means that Mr. Faul cannot be enrolled as a member of the Law Society of Alberta.

The Hearing Committee found that Mr. Faul's conduct in relation to his guilty plea to a criminal charge of assault, for which he was granted a conditional discharge, harmed the standing of the legal profession and was deserving of sanction. Conduct deserving of sanction is defined in the *Legal Profession Act* as conduct that is incompatible with the best interests of the public (including members of the Law Society) or conduct that tends to harm the standing of the legal profession generally.

Mr. Faul lives, articulated and worked in an approved working arrangement in Calgary, Alberta. As a student-at-law, Mr. Faul did not have his own law practice and therefore no custodian has been appointed.
