Section 61 Resignation – Deemed Disbarment

On October 8, 2024, a Resignation Committee of the Law Society of Alberta accepted an application by Aly-Khan Jivraj, a member of the Law Society who lives and previously practiced in Calgary, Alberta, to resign pursuant to section 61 of the Legal Profession Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. L-8 (Act). Mr. Jivraj is disbarred effective immediately.

At the time of his resignation, Mr. Jivraj was facing 12 citations related to the following conduct: failing to provide competent, timely, conscientious and diligent service to clients; acting in a conflict of interest; misappropriating or wrongfully converting trust funds; failing to comply with various trust accounting Rules (119.21(2) – (3), 119.24(1), 119.24(3), 119.36(1) – (4)) of the Rules of the Law Society with regard to dealing with his trust account; practicing law while suspended; failing to fulfill an undertaking; and failing to reply in a timely manner to communications from another lawyer. Mr. Jivraj admitted guilt without reservation to all 12 citations.

As Mr. Jivraj was not practicing at the time of his resignation, there is no custodian for his practice.
