Section 61 Resignation – Deemed Disbarment

On September 11, 2025, a Resignation Committee of the Law Society of Alberta accepted an application by **Brent R. Corbin**, a suspended member of the Law Society who lives and previously practiced in Fort McMurray, Alberta, to resign pursuant to section 61 of the *Legal Profession Act*, R.S.A. 2000, c. L-8. Mr. Corbin is disbarred effective September 11, 2025.

At the time of his resignation, Mr. Corbin was facing six open complaints and although no citations have been issued yet, Mr. Corbin admitted that the conduct was deserving of sanction. The admitted conduct includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- Failing to follow instructions of a client
- Failing to inform clients of significant events in their matters
- Misleading clients on the status of their matters
- Failing to cooperate with the Law Society on a number of occasions
- Failing to fulfill undertakings relating to management of client files and trust account
- Misuse of trust funds

The full written decision of the Resignation Committee will be posted to the Law Society of Alberta website when it is issued.
