Section 61 Resignation - Deemed Disbarment

On December 16, 2025, a Resignation Committee of the Law Society of Alberta accepted an application by Andrew S. Rice, a member of the Law Society who lives in Sherwood Park, Alberta, to resign pursuant to section 61 of the Legal Profession Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. L-8. Mr. Rice is disbarred effective immediately.

At the time of his resignation Mr. Rice was facing the following seven citations alleging conduct deserving of sanction:

- Failing to fulfill an undertaking provided to opposing counsel
- Failing to respond promptly to communications from opposing counsel
- Failing to comply with the requirements to obtain approvals to operate a trust account as set out in the Rules of the Law Society
- Improperly managing client funds in a breach of the Rules of the Law Society
- Misrepresenting to his clients that he was operating under a professional corporation when it did not exist
- Practicing law while suspended
- Failing to report a debt judgement to the Law Society

The written decision of the Resignation Committee will be posted to the Law Society of Alberta website when it is issued.
